COURT'S SUA SPONTE STANDING ORDER CONCERNING COVID-19 IN ALL CHILD PROTECTIVE SERVICES CASES

The 62nd Judicial District Court, State of Texas, hereby enters the following Standing Order in all Child Protective Services Cases pending and filed in this Court:


IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that all statutory deadlines and procedures for cases filed by or involving the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services are hereby extended for a period of 30 days following the date the Governor's State of Disaster has been lifted unless any deadline is extended for a longer period of time in accordance with the Texas Family Code.

All previously ordered parent-child visitation scheduled to take place between March 23, 2020 and May 1, 2020 are HEREBY ORDERED SUSPENDED in an effort to contain the spread of COVID-19 and to protect all parties.

The Department of Family and Protective Services is HEREBY ORDERED to make arrangements (to the extent feasible and possible) for telephone, Skype, Facetime or other virtual visits in place of in-person visitation between March 23, 2020 and May 1, 2020.

The Court will continue to hear 14 day Adversary hearings as needed.
